The motion of the Office of the Los Angeles City Attorney and the City of Oakland for leave to file an amicus curiae brief in support of Intervenor's motion to stay the district court's January 16, 2020 preliminary injunction order (Docket Entry No. 16 in No. 20-55106) is granted.

Intervenor's motion to stay the district court's January 16, 2020 preliminary injunction order pending these consolidated appeals (Docket Entry No. 14 in No. 20-55106) is denied. Intervenor has not made an adequate showing that it will be irreparably injured absent a stay, that a stay will not substantially injure the other parties, and that a stay would be in the public interest. *See Hilton v. Braunskill*, 481 U.S. 770, 776 (1987) (stating standard).

The motion by the California Employment Lawyers Association for an extension of time to file motions for leave to file amicus curiae briefs (Docket Entry No. 26 in No. 20-55106) is granted. Amicus curiae briefs submitted by the California Labor Federation AFL-CIO and by the Office of the Los Angeles City Attorney and the City of Oakland have been filed.

The California Employment Lawyers Association's request for a further extension of time to file its proposed amicus curiae brief (Docket Entry No. 28 in No. 20-55106) is granted. The proposed amicus curiae brief and any required motion for leave to file the brief is due April 8, 2020.

The unopposed motion for an extension of time to file the answering brief (Docket Entry No. 34 in No. 20-55106) is granted. The consolidated answering brief is due May 6, 2020. The optional reply briefs remain due within 21 days after service of the answering brief. *See* 9th Cir. R. 3-3(b).

These appeals shall be placed on the next available oral argument calendar. *See* 9th Cir. Gen. Order 3.3(f).
